

# **Health Office Information**

#### **IMPORTANT NOTE:**

2022-2023 PSD Authorization and Release Forms as well as health care plans EXPIRE on May 26, 2023. If you plan on keeping medication at school for the 2023-2024 school year, complete a new and updated authorization form and healthcare plan.

#### **Medication Pick Up**

Medications cannot be sent home with students at the end of the school year. Parents must pick up all medications on or before May 26, 2023.

Medications must be picked up by the end of the school day.

REMINDER: the last day of school is a half day. If medications need to be picked up before the last day of school, please make arrangements with the school nurse or health tech.

#### **Medication Disposal**

The school nurse will follow state guidelines and dispose of all medications not picked up by 11:15am on the last day of school. Medications can't be kept in the health office over the summer. Thank you for your understanding.

#### Tdap Vaccine Requirement 2023-2024 School Year

#### All 6th through 12th graders are required to have had a Tdap booster

- Most secondary students have had this booster, and it is recorded ontheir school record.
- Students entering 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade may still need the vaccine.
- The "p" (pertussis) has been added to the standard Td booster in orderto protect teens against whooping cough.

#### Prior to the first day of school, a copy of the immunization record from the doctor's office must be provided to the school.

- If they have already received the booster, you may give this record to their current school before school is out.
- vaccines are recommended for Hepatitis A, Influenza, Meningococcal disease, and Human papillomavirus (HPV), but are not required.

Colorado law (<u>Board of Health rule 6 CCR 1009-2</u>) requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed child cares to be vaccinated against certain diseases, unless an exemption is filed.

#### **Exceptions:**

Beginning in the 2021-2022 school year, the process of filing a nonmedical exemption changed. There are two ways to file a nonmedical exemption. Be sure to check with your student's school or child care to find out if it needs a copy of the certificate of exemption.

- File the certificate of nonmedical exemption WITH a signature from an immunizing provider OR
- File the certificate of nonmedical exemption received upon the completion of our online education module.
  - o Immunization Education Module
- Parents of students in grades K-12 claiming a nonmedical exemption must file one annually. Nonmedical
  exemptions expire June 30 each year. If you submit a nonmedical exemption on or before June 30, it will
  not be valid for the upcoming school year unless you signed the exemption during early registration.



# PLAY AND REST

We are moving toward the end of an exciting school year. Our classrooms have exciting events planned to celebrate, play, and have fun together as classroom communities. We are also looking forward to celebrating our Zach community at our Picnic on the Playground gathering on May 4 from 2:45 pm-4:30 pm. Hooray for play and celebration as a community!

As we shift to the summer months, our children may have the benefit of spending time with friends and family, exploring new interests (or current passions) in camps or classes, spending more time outside, and possibly some additional unstructured time to rest and play. The benefits of some unstructured playtime include increased opportunities for problem solving, planning, developing new ideas, and fostering creativity. There is also evidence supporting the connection between mindfulness and executive functioning skills. Time to just "be" without screens allows children to attune to their environment, their senses, and their own thoughts and can help support this practice.

#### **Incident Report**

Students, parents and staff can report experiences that negatively impact their education based on race, gender, culture, religious belief, socio-economic status and sexual orientation.
